FACULTY MEMBERS REAP HONORS

Dr. Patricia McDougall- Covin, the William L.

Haeberle Professor of Entrepreneurship and director of the Institute for International Business in the IU Kelley School of Business. has received two of the most prestigious faculty honors this past year. In August, the Academy of Management's **Entrepreneurship Division** presented the 2015 Foundational Paper Award to her. This award is given annually for a paper that has had a lasting and positive influence on the field of entrepreneurship. This recognizes a published paper that has significantly and positively changed the conversation in the field of entrepreneurship research.

To be eligible for this award, foundational papers will have been published for at least 10 years in order to evaluate the lasting impact of the research paper. She and her co-author were recognized for their 1994

article in the Journal of International Business on the early internationalization of new ventures. This article had already been recognized earlier with the Palgrave Macmillan Journal of International Business Studies Decade Award. Dr. McDougall-Covin's scholarly efforts truly shaped the field of international entrepreneurship.

In other international efforts. Dr. McDougall-Covin was also honored by Indiana University with the prestigious John W. Ryan Award for **Distinguished Contributions** to International Programs and Studies. This award honors faculty members from all IU campuses for exceptional contributions to the university's international programs and studies. The award was presented by **IU President Michael** McRobbie to Dr. McDougall-Covin at a special banquet event in April.

University Distinguished Professor. The Ameritech Chair of Economic Development & Director of the Institute for Development Strategies was recently honored with the 2015 Entrepreneurship Mentor Award for his distinguished efforts in developing the next generation of entrepreneurship scholars. He received the award at a special awards ceremony at the National Academy of Management in Vancouver, Canada in August of 2015. This prestigious global award recognizes senior scholars who are exemplary advisors and mentors to the next generation of entrepreneurship professors and is given only when an individual scholar has demonstrated an outstanding

national record of developing these young scholars.

Dr. Audretsch was noted for working diligently to develop promising doctoral students and young assistant professors through the years in the entrepreneurial field by nurturing their development in research and professional roles, and providing support in the early stages of their academic careers.

Dr. Audretsch is the fourth IU entrepreneurship professor to be given this award of distinction.
Dr. Jeffrey G. Covin was honored in 2005, Dr. Dean A. Shepherd was honored in 2008, and Dr. Donald F. Kuratko was honored in 2014. No university has ever had two faculty members receive this honor, let alone four!

Added to the E-Team

Dr. Rene M. Bakker and **Dr. Matthew Grimes** joined the Kelley School of Business as Assistant Professors of Entrepreneurship in the fall of 2015.

Dr. Bakker's work has been published in leading management journals, including the *Academy of Management Journal*, *Strategic Management Journal*, and *Organization Science*. He currently sits on the editorial board of *Organization Studies*.

Dr. Bakker completed his graduate studies at Tilburg University in the Netherlands. His research takes place at the intersection of Strategic Management and Entrepreneurship studying the process and sequence of alliance formation and alliance termination, the timing of strategic decisions, and the management of temporary projects by entrepreneurial firms.

Dr. Grimes completed his graduate studies at Oxford University and Vanderbilt University. He is an accomplished researcher and studies the mechanisms through which disruptive and values-based innovations are introduced, organized, and sustained over time. His ongoing work on the micro-foundations of social change and innovation makes a significant contribution to those literatures.

Dr. Grimes' work has been published in leading management journals, including the Academy of Management Journal, Academy of Management Review, and Entrepreneurship Theory & Practice. He currently sits on the editorial board of the Academy of Management Journal.

W. Wesley Pennington, III joined the Kelley entrepreneur faculty this past January. He is completing his PhD dissertation at Indiana University in BioInformatics with a minor in Entrepreneurship. Professor Pennington researches corporate innovation as well as the commercialization of technologies. Previously he was a technology commercialization officer for the Indiana University Research & Technology Corporation. Pennington has been published in the *Small Business Economics*.

Clapp IDEA Cross-Campus

Competition encourages student entrepreneurs

The Johnson Center for Entrepreneurship & Innovation sponsors the IU Cross-campus Clapp IDEA (Innovations Developed for Entrepreneurial Action) Competition which was held in early April this year. The 2016 Clapp IDEA Competition continues to be great success across the IU Bloomington campus.

Over 85 entrants from IU schools including Jacobs School of Music, Informatics & Computing, School of Education, Kelley School of Business, and for the first time the BioTech program from the College of Arts & Science participated in the competition. Investors, IU alums and advisors of the Johnson Center with entrepreneurial backgrounds in various industries, were asked to evaluate each team based on their written plan and their presentation. Judges considered the innovative concept and the overall feasibility of its implementation. Although they had a difficult time choosing among the 23 semi-finalists, they named two teams to share the 1st prize money, and awarded space in the Hoosier Hatchery, JCEI's student incubator, to all 7 finalists.

Critique, with team members Matthew Callison and Tiffany Roman, from the School of Education and Dash Messenger, with team members Vinayak Vedantam, Ben Mizes and Deepak Bharanikana, from the Kelley School of Business shared first place honors.

The two teams walked away with \$7,500 each and space in the Hoosier Hatchery to continue develop and grow their companies.

The William L. Haeberle Entrepreneurial Legacy Award

Cathy Langham honored

Since 2005, The William L. Haeberle Entrepreneurial Legacy Award is a special award that is given only when an individual has had an indelible impact on the entire Indiana entrepreneurship culture. This year the award was given to Cathy Langham, President and CEO of Langham Logistics, LLC.

Cathy Langham opened trucking and air freight franchises three years out of college, then sold both of them a few years later and co-founded Langham Logistics, Inc. with her sister and brother. Ms. Langham,

a graduate of North Central High School and the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University, focuses on business strategy, leadership, and critical industry issues such as infrastructure and security. She provides her logistics expertise to business leaders in a wide spectrum of industries including pharmaceutical, food and beverage, automotive, retail, and other industries with complex supply chains.

Cathy functions as the company's President and CEO, and spends most of her time in three key

areas: strategic direction, customer relations, and civic leadership. Thirteen years ago Langham's visibility as CEO of a fast-growing business enterprise earned her firm a visit from then President George W. Bush. In 2005, she accepted a role on the Indiana Economic Development Corporation Board at the invitation of Governor Mitch Daniels. In 2015 she Co-chaired (with the Lt. Governor) Governor Mike Pence's Blue Ribbon panel charged with creating and prioritizing the next 10 to 30 years of transportation infrastructure for the State of Indiana.

Langham was also Vice Chair of Super Bowl 2012 and is a member of the boards of directors of Finishline,

HH Gregg (Chairperson), and Celadon Group Inc. She serves as Chairperson of the Central Indiana Corporate Partnership (CICP), and on the board of Conexus Indiana.

Very few individuals could say they have affected an entire state the way Dr. Bill Haeberle has. Dr Haeberle was talking and living entrepreneurship long before anyone else used the word. He began his teaching career at IU in 1946. – Teaching in the areas of managing growth, management and most significantly – entrepreneurship. Since that early start, Dr. Haeberle has

taught entrepreneurship to hundreds of students and has been involved in over 50 business start-ups, acquisitions, consulting projects, 21 Limited Partnerships, 30 Trusts, and participated on numerous advisory and executive boards. Today, Dr. Haeberle is Professor Emeritus of Management and Entrepreneurship at the Kelley School of Business with an entrepreneurial career spanning nearly seven decades.

Past recipients of the Haeberle Legacy Award include: Patricia R. Miller, Vera Bradley; Mickey Maurer, Indiana Business Journal and the National Bank of Indianapolis; and Scott Dorsey, ExactTarget and High Alpha.
